Dear Governor Dunleavy:

In 2018 I received a letter from the State of Alaska requesting a determination of a commercial fishery failure due to a fishery resource disaster. The request relates to the impacts to the 2018 Chignik Management Area sockeye salmon fishery in Alaska resulting from unfavorable ocean conditions beyond the control of fishery managers that reduced biomass and access to the fishery in 2018.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's National Marine Fisheries Service evaluated information from the Alaska Department of Fish and Game to assess whether a commercial fishery failure occurred due to a fishery resource disaster. After reviewing the information, I have found that the request for a commercial fishery failure due to a fishery resource disaster for the 2018 Chignik Management Area sockeye salmon fishery in Alaska meets the requirements under section 312(a) of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act.

This determination now makes this fishery eligible for fishery disaster assistance. The 2019 Consolidated Omnibus Appropriation (PL 116-6) included \$15 million for fishery disasters, and the 2019 Supplemental Disaster Appropriations (PL 116-20) included \$150 million for fishery disaster assistance. The Department of Commerce will determine an allocation of funds for this fishery disaster and provide the State of Alaska information regarding the award process and requirements for these funds.
