

2018 TRIBAL NOMINATIONS TO THE
PACIFIC FISHERY MANAGEMENT COUNCIL

Effective August 11, 2018 a tribal obligatory seat became vacant on the Pacific Fishery Management Council. When a tribal seat becomes vacant, the Secretary solicits written nominations from the heads of governments of those Indian Tribes with federally recognized fishing rights from the States of California, Oregon, Washington, and Idaho. The list of nominees must contain a total of at least three individuals who are knowledgeable and experienced regarding fishery resources under the authority of the Pacific Fishery Management Council. Listed below are the nominations for the seat in alphabetical order.
