* Billfish and Swordfish Tournaments

All Atlantic HMS tournaments must register with NOAA Fisheries. If a billfish or swordfish is caught and entered in a registered tournament, the tournament operator is required to report the fish to NOAA Fisheries, and anglers need not report that fish through this system. * North Carolina and Maryland

Anglers <u>must</u> report all landings of swordfish, billfish, and bluefin tuna (including bluefin tuna dead discards).*

The permitted owner of the boat, including Charter/Headboats, or a designee, is responsible for reporting **within 24 hours.**
